

# EYFS and KSI Easter Activities

Decorate hard boiled eggs. You could create your favourite characters or make a pattern.



Why not try an egg and spoon race—you could make it in to an obstacle course to create more challenge!



Design your own Easter eggs. Which colours have you used? Have you used any 2D shapes?

Pin the tail on the rabbit. Help your children draw a rabbit, blindfold them and use a cotton wool ball or pom-pom as a tail.



Create a set of bunny ears. Add your name onto the head band.



Go on a word hunt for these Easter words... You could hide them around the house and in the garden. For older children you could write clues to help them find the words.

# KS2 Easter Activities

Create an intricate pattern or design on a hard boiled egg. If you put food colouring in the water as you boil it will create a coloured background.



You could use an old sock to make a sock bunny, stuff it with the other sock.



If you have some wool at home you could create a pom-pom animal. A chick, a bunny or a sheep would make a lovely Easter gift.



Draw a treasure map for an Easter Egg hunt.

# Easter Recipes



## Chocolate Nests

### Ingredients

225g/8oz plain chocolate, broken into pieces

2 tbsp golden syrup

50g/2oz butter

75g/2¾oz cornflakes

36 mini chocolate eggs

### Method

1. Melt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water. Stir the mixture until smooth.

2. Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.

3. Divide the mixture between 12 paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.



## Easter Brownies

### Ingredients

dark chocolate 200g, chopped

milk chocolate 200g, chopped

butter 50g

golden syrup 1 tbsp

Rich Tea biscuits 100g, broken into pieces

mini marshmallows 100g

Crunchie bars 2, roughly chopped

mini eggs 40

### Method

1. Gently melt both chocolates, butter and golden syrup in a heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water (or heat in short blasts in the microwave).

2. Stir in the biscuits, marshmallows and Crunchie bits. Line a tin with a double layer of clingfilm then tip in the chocolate mix and level out (it will be quite uneven on the surface). Push the mini eggs down into the surface (you can halve some of them if you like). Put in the fridge to set for 3 hours or overnight.
