







































Ladybird Doubles












Say the colour pattern out loud and then continue the pattern by colouring it in.

Exploring patterns

- Show your son/daughter a simple movement pattern, such as touch your head, touch your knees.
- Tell your son/daughter that you want them to watch your movement pattern and then do the next action.
- Show your son/daughter three units of the pattern (e.g. head, knees, head, knees) before inviting them to continue the pattern.

Questions

- What actions did I do?
- How many different actions did I do?
- What action should we do next?
- What can you tell me about this pattern?
- Can you continue this pattern?
- What action should we do after we touch our knees?

Practical activities

- Use beads and laces/string to create repeating patterns.
- Continue a repeating pattern using coloured bricks.
- Make fruit salad kebabs that show repeating fruit patterns.
- Create, describe and continue patterns made using objects around the house such as toys, pasta, fruit, vegetables, tins etc.


