This year all the classes at Brooke Primary Academy will be named after musical greats.


Our class will be named after

#### Camille Saint-Saëns

Camille Saint-Saëns was a French composer. He played several instruments, including the organ and piano. He was inspired by famous musicians of his day including Schumann and Wagner. Camille Saint-Saëns was a teacher for a few years and influenced other famous composers such as Faure and Ravel. He was considered a child genius and composed his first piece of work aged just 3!

The most famous piece of music Camille Saint-Saëns wrote was a symphonic poem called La Danse Macabre. You can listen to it by clicking below (the sound is a bit quiet at first).
