PSHCE Monday - Jigsaw

Write down how you are feeling at the moment. On the grid on the right are a list of things you can do to make yourself feel better. Do 2 or 3 of these things, and think about you are feeling. Has your feeling changed? Is it for the better?

When you are done, write down a list of things that always make you feel better, that you could do the next time you are feeling sad or worried.



This week we would like you to write a story about your character living in Ancient Rome.

Create a character for someone who lived in Ancient Rome.

Write character description for your character. Think carefully about what they look like, what they like/dislike, what their personality is like.

Write a paragraph for a setting description. Remember to include expanded noun phrases, commas in a list.

Now, your character meets Julius Caesar who is on the run. You can decide why your character/s meets Julius Caesar. Remember you need to try and include a problem in your story.

Write a resolution/ending for your story.
Think carefully about whether there is a hero, a cliffhanger or a happy ending.

Write a letter for your new class teacher.

You could include:

- * likes/dislikes
- * hobbies/interests
- *subjects you enjoy
- *things you like to learn
- *questions you would like to ask your new teacher
