Learning Journey Showcase

They will also write instructions for their roman slaves to follow when they are preparing the food. They will share information and research of the Roman Empire through the retelling of the historical events in Pompeii and the reign of Emperor Caesar. The children will also use their sculptured cups and plates made using their design and technology skills. We hope after this showcase, year three will have a solid understanding of how Britain has been impacted by the Roman Empire.


