

	<ul> <li><u>Citizens (PSHE)</u></li> <li>This is not a statutory subject although the DFE state that it should be taught; however, schools have the flexibility to decide on their own content, based on their context.</li> <li>We follow the <u>JIGSAW</u> scheme of learning for PSHE.</li> <li>In Year 2, we will begin by looking at the units 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Difference'. During these units, the children will think about:</li> <li>their hopes and fears for the year ahead</li> <li>their rights and responsibilities as a member of our class/school</li> <li>what is right and wrong</li> <li>how people can be different</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Artists</li> <li>As Artists, we will be looking at Sculpture. We will: <ul> <li>use tools and equipment safely and in the correct way</li> <li>use equipment to roll, pinch and knead with increasing confidence</li> <li>experiment in a variety of malleable media such as clay, papier-mache, salt dough, modroc.</li> <li>use clay, modroc or other malleable material to create a tool that could be used by a coal miner</li> <li>explore carving as a form of 3D art</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Designers (DT)</li> <li>As Designers, we will create a cart with moving wheels.
