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Dear Parents / Carers

We would like to take this opportunity to share with you how we teach phonics and early reading at Brooke Primary Academy. We follow Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised to teach phonics and early reading. Your child will take part in daily phonics lessons and reading sessions three times a week. Your child will bring home two books: a reading practise book and a sharing book.

## Reading Practise Book

This will be at the correct phonic phase for your child. They should be able to read this book fluently and independently. This book will be carefully matched to your child's current level and they will have read it a few times in school before bringing it home. If your child is reading their book with little support, please don't worry that it is too easy - your child is developing fluency and confidence by practising reading. Listen to them read the book and after they have finished spend some time talking about the book together. Celebrate their successes and give them lots of praise. Please sign and date your child's reading record book when you have listened to them read at home.

Children will change this book once a week on a Wednesday after they have read it several times in school. Reading and listening to the same book multiple times will allow children to develop fluency, dive deeper into the meaning of the book and make connections between different books they have read. Children need to bring their book and reading record into school every day.

## Sharing Book

The sharing book is the book children choose from our school library. Each class has a timetabled slot (please ask your child's class teacher if you are unsure when this is). If children are to become lifelong readers it is essential that they are encourage to read for pleasure. To help foster a love of reading children will bring home a book to share and enjoy with their parents/carers. These books offer a wealth of opportunities for enjoying the story and talking about the characters, events and pictures. Your child might not be able to read this book independently. This book is for you to read to or with your child and repeated readings will bring more enjoyment and benefits.

At Brooke Primary Academy we expect children to read at home at least 3 times per week. Research shows that reading at home has a significant positive impact on children's development in reading.
