<p><b>During EYFS</b></p> <p>Music is embedded within the Early Years' Foundation Stage Curriculum through the use of the indoor and outdoor learning environment and classroom provision. The children are given a wealth of opportunities to engage in activities, both child-initiated and adult directed, which enable them to develop their early musical skills.</p> <p>Music in the Early Years Foundation Stage is incorporated into all aspects of the curriculum. However, it can primarily be classified as 'Expressive Arts and Design'.</p>						
Foundation 1	<p><u>Expressive Arts and Design</u></p> <p>3 and year-olds will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Listen with increased attention to sounds</li> <li>• Respond to what they have heard, expressing their thoughts and feelings</li> <li>• Remember and sing entire songs</li> <li>• Sing the pitch of a tone sung by another person</li> <li>• Sing the melodic shape (moving melody, such as up and down, down and up) of familiar songs</li> <li>• Create their own songs or improvise a song around one they know</li> <li>• Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas</li> </ul>

	<p><u>Expressive Art and Design</u></p> <p>Children in Reception will be learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses.</li> <li>• Watch and talk about dance and performance art, expressing their feelings and responses.</li> <li>• Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody.</li> <li>• Develop storylines in their pretend play.</li> <li>• Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.</li> </ul> <p><b>ELG:</b> Being Imaginative and Expressive Children at the expected level of development will: - Invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and their teacher; - Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs; Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others, and – when appropriate – try to move in time with music.</p> <p>During EYFS the children will use a variety of untuned instruments</p>					
<p><b>During KS1</b></p> <p><u>Pupils should be taught to:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes</li> <li>• play tuned and untuned instruments musically</li> <li>• listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music</li> <li>• experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.</li> </ul>

Pupils should be taught to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression</li><li>• improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music</li><li>• listen with attention to detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory</li><li>• use and understand staff and other musical notations</li><li>• appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers and musicians</li><li>• develop an understanding of the history of music.</li></ul>
