Develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient. (Physical development)

Form lower-case and capital letters correctly. (Literacy)

At the end of F2, Children at the expected level of development will:

Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing – using the tripod grip in almost all cases. (ELG: Fine Motor Skills)

Write recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed. (ELG: Writing)
