
















## During this theme we will develop:

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## Mathematics

#### We will learn to:

- Say numbers in the correct order
- Count objects correctly
- Use our fingers to show numbers
- Quickly recognise small amounts
- Find numbers within the environment
- Talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes
- Sequence events and use the language of time
- Compare size
- Recognise and discuss patterns
- Solve problems
- Understand and use positional language

During Autumn 1 we will focus on the number 1.

During Autumn 2 we will focus on the number 2.

#### Literacy

#### We will learn to:

- Look at books independently, handling them carefully and correctly.
- Talk about books.
- Name the different parts of a book.
- Sequence pages from a book.
- Recognise letters within our own name.
- Begin to form letters within our own name.
- Make marks using a variety of media and for different purposes.

We will also bring in our favourite book from home to 'Show and Tell.'

We will visit the school library once a week.

# Communication and Language

#### We will learn to:

- Listen to Stories.
- Tell stories.
- Use language to share our feelings, thoughts, ideas and experiences.
- Use language to organise and extend our play.
- Understand simple questions.
- Follow simple instructions.
- Use language within role play scenarios.
- Pronounce words correctly.
- Sing a large repertoire of songs and rhymes.

#### **Phonological Awareness**

#### We will learn to:

- Distinguish environmental sounds.
- Distinguish instrumental sounds.
- Use our body and voices to make sounds.
- Listen to and join in with rhythm, rhymes, poems and songs.
- Identify words beginning with the same sounds.
- Blend and segment sounds within words.

We will follow Foundations for Phonics from Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised.

# **Understanding The World**

## We will learn to:

- Use our senses to explore natural materials
- Talk about what we can see in and around the school grounds
- Begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment by taking care of our Foundation Stage garden and school garden
- Understand our own lives and family history by sharing our baby photographs, family photographs, experience of pets and celebrations
- Develop positive attitudes towards differences in people. We will use mirrors to look at ourselves and others. We will share our preferences and discuss our choices.

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

# We will learn to:

- Follow the school rules and begin to understand why they are important
- Discuss feelings
- Manage basic emotions
- Take turns and share resources
- Set simple goals
- Develop a sense of a membership of the school community and the local community
- Meet our own care needs
- Make healthy choices

Identify where we live within the world and begin to understand that there are other countries

We will bake every half term.

- Snacktime discussions
- Activities from the Jigsaw scheme
- Parent/Carer events
- Special celebrations relating to Halloween, Bonfire Night and Christmas
- Visitors to the school and a school trip
- Additional adult-led activities related to the theme
- Access to the continuous provision areas

#### **Physical Development**

We will learn to develop our fine motor and gross motor skills by:

- Take part in dough disco sessions
- Take part in pencil control activities
- Using one -handed equipment to make marks within different media
- Exploring the small world resources
- Completing puzzles
- Taking part in arts and crafts activities linked to the theme - such as making an owl, Christmas card and calendar
- Balancing on the trim trail and climbing frame
- Travelling around the playground running, hopping skipping, jumping and using the bikes and scooters
- Throwing catching and kicking balls and beanbags
- Collaborating with others to manage construction equipment to build houses and homes, trees, forests and animals
- Performing patterns of movement to music, songs, rhythms and rhymes

# **Expressive Arts and Design**

#### We will learn to:

- Take part in role play scenarios and dress up in different costumes
- Develop narratives around small world toys
- Construct imaginative small worlds
- Explore and join different materials
- Complete crafts linked to the theme such as Christmas cards and calendars
- Use drawing, painting, printing and collaging to explore colour, pattern and to create images such as self-portraits, family portraits and animals
- Remember and sing songs such as Ten Little
  Fingers and Ten Little Toes as well as many classic
  nursery rhymes
- Perform songs and rhymes for parents at our Parent Events and Nativity concert
- Play percussion instruments and copy and create rhythms
- Bake foods linked to the theme
