Art and Design

Design and Technology

Year 1 and 3 have completed their Design and Technology units. Year 1 have designed, made and evaluated a scene with a moving animal. The animal moves with a slider or lever. The children all worked hard and persevered to make the slider or lever for their animal. Year 3 have perfected their sewing skills using the blanket and running stitch to create a wallet for themselves, a friend or a family member to store coins and cards in. They included press studs to ensure that the wallet was secure. Mrs Brown (Design and Technology Subject Lead) has enjoyed talking to the children about their end products.
